The Project

The University of Nairobi has received funding from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to support implementation of the Kenya Health Partnerships for Quality Services (HIV, FP/RMNCAH, Nutrition and WASH) in Nairobi and Kajiado Counties through the USAID Fahari ya Jamii Project.

University of Nairobi/Fahari Ya Jamii Project is issuing a Request for Applications (RFA) to provide technical system strengthening support for the FYJ project under USAID Contract No.:72061521CA00014. The Fahari Ya Jamii project is seeking applications from parties interested in implementing grant-funded project activities, based on the terms of references contained in the herein.

Applicants who had submitted their applications in the previous advertisement are advised to reapply.

This Request for Applications (RFA) seeks applicants interested in proposing grant-funded activities to support program goals. Specifically, the program is seeking to fund HIV Testing Coverage (HTS) and Linkage Activities:

FYJ Program Request for Applications.

1. Scope of Work for HTS and Linkage

This document describes the scope of work for local partner/subawardee in supporting HIV testing services and linkage interventions in Fahari Ya Jamii supported facilities.

2. Background:

According to the latest NACC report (2018), national performance towards the 90-90-90 targets stood as follows: 66% HIV testing coverage, 67% linkage to treatment, and 83% viral load suppression. The annual prevalence is currently at 4.9% among adults between 15-64 years while the annual HIV incidence is 0.14% among adults (15-64 years) corresponding to 36,000 new infections annually (KENPHIA 2018). New infections are higher among women than men with a third of all new infections contributed by AGYWs. This indicates that women are more vulnerable to new infections.

Nairobi County, the Capital City of Kenya, is one of Kenya's 47 counties contributing to more than 80% of new HIV infections, 80% of people living with HIV (PLHIV), and 80% of unmet need. Nairobi

County is one of the 14 high ART coverage counties that collectively contribute to 55% of the national HIV burden. It has a highly mobile population due to in-county migration and it also hosts refugees from neighboring countries. In addition, many individuals work in the city during the day but reside in peri-urban towns in the neighboring Kiambu, Machakos and Kajiado counties. The HIV prevalence is 3.8%, the ART coverage is 90% among adults and 54% among children. MTCT rates, self-testing rates, and Linkage and retention are still lower than the national targets.

Kajiado County is situated to the south of Nairobi County and borders Tanzania to the south. Its population consists of the indigenous nomadic Maasai pastoralists; workers in Nairobi County who reside in peri-urban centers of Ngong, Kiserian and Ongata Rongai; and other residents who live and work in the county. In Kajiado, The HIV Prevalence is 4.6%, the ART coverage is at 65% in adults while ART coverage in children is at 69%; MTCT rates and self-testing rates also remain low.

In line with the UNAIDS 95-95-95 global strategy, timely HIV diagnosis, optimal linkage, and retention to care for persons diagnosed with HIV, increased coverage of ART and viral suppression are essential for improving the health outcomes and wellness of people living with HIV. On a positive note, remarkable gains have been made in mitigating HIV effects, not only in Nairobi County, and Kajiado County but also other counties in Kenya.

Moving forward, there is need for innovative solutions, specifically those that seek to find and link men and adolescents to treatment, conduct more case findings through partner notifications within the informal settlements focusing on high burden Sub-Counties.

3. Objective of the SOW

The Main objective of this call of applications is to support facility and community based HTS and linkage interventions in 15 Fahari Ya Jamii-supported health facilities in Nairobi County and 5 in Kajiado County. The project will work through HTS providers to intensify HIV case finding in project supported facilities.

Targeted outcomes:

The project will be measured on an ongoing basis to and the expected target outcomes at the end of the grant period include:

- Enhanced capacity to support HIV case finding interventions in project supported sites
- Increased uptake of PNS and index testing services among newly diagnosed clients and other priority populations
- Increased uptake of HIV Self Testing among targeted population
- >95% of individuals testing positive for HIV being initiated on ART within two weeks of identification

4. Description of activities

Specifically, the program is seeking to fund the following activities within the 9-month grant period (2021- 2022). The organization shall independently perform all work and furnish all labor, materials, supplies, equipment, and services (except as otherwise specified in the contract) to perform the following services:

- a) Support targeted facility-based HIV testing interventions:
 - Create demand for HIV testing services
 - Stringent risk-based eligibility screening in the outpatient and in-patient departments
 - HIVST modality to complement regular testing modalities, and to support testing of contacts in aPNS
 - Setting up of special hours targeting men and adolescents with HTS
- b) Implement index testing and aPNS
 - Elicitation of contacts from all HIV infected clients
 - Use of HIVST kits to conduct testing for identified contacts

- IPV screening before offering aPNS and before HIVST issuance with first line support (LIVES) where IPV is detected
- c) Support community- based HIV testing interventions
 - Implement Community ART groups in project facilities
 - Conduct home visits and physical tracing for priority clients including High viral load clients, defaulters, and interruption in treatment clients
- d) Strengthen Quality assurance
 - Joint supportive supervision
 - Observed practice and debriefing sessions (counsellor support supervision) for HTS providers
 - Lot based validation for new lots of rapid test kits (RTKs)
 - Enrollment of HTS providers on proficiency testing (PT) with corrective action for those with unsatisfactory results
- e) Link >95% of all newly- diagnosed patients to HIV care
 - Physical escorts to CCC for clients testing HIV positive
 - Weekly follow up for non-linked clients
 - Use of linkage register to document linkage outcomes
 - Intensified treatment preparation for newly diagnosed clients

5. Reporting and Monitoring Process:

- Develop and submit a comprehensive work plan, including detailed Gantt charts, and performance monitoring plan.
- Submit monthly update reports to Fahari Ya Jamii on the status of implementation activities.
 - o Reports will include age disaggregation where possible.
- Submit a final report to Fahari Ya Jamii that includes the overall successes of the grant, challenges, lessons learned, and final performance monitoring plan that demonstrates outcomes achieved.
- Participate in planning meetings as needed.
- Develop success stories on lessons learned and results of the work

- **4.** Applicants must have a DUNS number and be registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) as a pre-requisite to receive USAID funds.

Applicants fully meeting the Eligibility Criteria will undergo a responsibility determination prior to award to ensure that they have the technical and organizational capacity to manage a USAID-funded award.
